## Elections Office shares list of vote center locations in Placer County for upcoming primary election

AUBURN, Calif. -- The Elections Office's recent adoption of the Voter's Choice Act (VCA) election model means expanded in-person voting opportunities for Placer County voters! No longer assigned to a specific voting location, all eligible voters can now vote in person at any vote center in Placer County. Seven of these vote centers will be open for 11 days of in-person voting starting Feb. 24, while the remaining 22 locations will be open for four days, starting March 2. Daily hours of operation for all locations are 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., except for Election Day (March 5), when they'll be open 7 a.m. to 8 p.m.

Vote-by-mail ballots for the March 5, 2024 Presidential Primary Election were mailed to every active voter per California law; voters can return those ballots by mail, by using one of 30 official ballot drop boxes located throughout the county, or in-person to the Elections Office or any open vote center. Voters may also visit any vote center during the in-person voting period to have their voted vote-by-mail ballot scanned and counted immediately, ensuring their votes are included in the first election results released on Election Night.
