All Placer County registered voters will receive a voter information guide for the June 7, 2022, Statewide Direct Primary Election. Voter information guides will be mailed the week of May 2. The guide will provide voters with important information about items to be voted on this election. In addition, a list of drop box locations will be listed within the guide.

All active registered Placer County voters will be issued a ballot by mail for the June 7, 2022, Statewide Direct Primary Election as required by Assembly Bill 37. Ballots will enter the mail by May 9, 2022. Voters may request a replacement ballot to be mailed to them by calling our Elections Office at 530-886-5650 or toll-free in California 1-800-824-8683. Voters may also pick up a replacement vote by mail ballot in our Elections Office beginning May 9, 2022, through Election Day, June 7, 2022. The Elections Office is located at 2956 Richardson Drive in Auburn. Office hours are Monday through Friday, from 8 AM to 5 PM. Election Day hours are 7 AM to 8 PM. The Elections Office will be open the two weekends prior to the Primary Election (May 28 and 29 & June 4 and 5) from 9 AM to 4 PM, and on Memorial Day, May 31, 2022, from 9 AM to 4 PM.

Also, in accordance with state law, Placer County is offering a remote accessible vote by mail (RAVBM) option to all registered voters. RAVBM is an accessible option for voters to receive their ballots digitally at home and mark them independently and privately before mailing them back to us. Please visit www.placercountyelections.gov or call our Elections Office at (530) 886-5650 to request further information.

Placer County will be staffing 146 polling places which will offer in person voting, voter registration, and accessible voting machines. If you choose not to return the ballot that was mailed to you and want to vote at your polling place instead, bring your vote by mail ballot to avoid the potential of voting provisionally.

Some polling places will have translated sample ballots in Spanish, Tagalog, Korean, or Punjabi that voters can use as a reference when voting. The polling places required to have them are determined by the Secretary of State. There is a complete list of precincts that will have a translated sample ballot in the voter information guide. You may also request to have one sent to you before Election Day, please call our office at 530-886-5650. Requests must be received no later than 7 days before Election Day.

If you do not receive your voter information guide or ballot by May 23, or if you misplace it, please contact the Elections Office at 530-886-5650 or toll free in California 1-800-824-8683 for a duplicate voter information guide and/or ballot or visit our website at www.placercountyelections.gov where you can find an online voter guide.

If you have interacted recently with the DMV, your voter registration information may have been changed. It is important to confirm your voter status, political party preference, address, and all other pertinent information to make sure you are still registered correctly. Check your status at voterstatus.sos.ca.gov.
