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The last day to register to vote for the March 26, 2019 Senate District 1 Special Primary Election is March 11, 2019. Registration forms may be picked up at all post offices, libraries, and Department of Motor Vehicles within Placer County or online at [www.registertovote.ca.gov](http://www.registertovote.ca.gov). To further assist Placer County voters, voter registration forms will be placed outside the Placer County Elections Office entrance at 2956 Richardson Drive in Auburn, on March 11th until 12:00 AM (midnight). Completed registration forms will be processed the next morning. In addition, completed registration forms can be placed in the secure, drive-up drop-off box located in front of the Elections Office.

To provide better service to voters, the Placer County Elections Office will be open for business the weekend prior to the Election: March 23rd and March 24th, 9:00 AM to 4:00 PM. Elections staff will be available on these days to process vote-by-mail requests and issue vote-by-mail ballots over the counter. Voters may call 530-886-5650 or toll-free in California, 1-800-824-8683, with questions regarding the upcoming election.

“This department is always looking for ways to be more accessible to the voters of the county”, said Ryan Ronco, Placer County Clerk-Recorder-Registrar of Voters. “We hope weekend hours enable even more people to take advantage of vote-by-mail voting and have their voices heard.”

If you have interacted recently with the DMV, your voter registration information may have been changed. It is important to confirm your voter status; political party preference, vote by mail status, address and all other pertinent information to make sure you are still registered correctly. Voters who miss the registration deadline may come to the Elections Office, during normal business hours and complete a Conditional Voter Registration.
