## **EARLY VOTING BEGINS FOR JUNE 5, 2018 STATEWIDE DIRECT PRIMARY ELECTION**

**AUBURN, CALIF.** – Early Voting is underway for the June 5, 2018 Statewide Direct Primary Election. The Placer County Elections Office opened an Early Voting Center Monday for registered voters of Placer County.

Registrar of Voters Ryan Ronco said, “As a convenience to voters during the Early Voting period, voters from any precinct in Placer County may come to our office to cast a ballot or drop off a voted mail ballot.”

Ronco added, “We have also significantly expanded our Vote By Mail Ballot Drop Box locations to include 14 locations around Placer County to make it easier for residents to vote and return their ballots.”

### **Early Voting**

During regular business hours, the two weekends leading up to Election Day, and on Memorial Day, any voter in Placer County can vote early at the Elections Office located at 2956 Richardson Drive in Auburn. Polling place voters can cast a ballot printed on demand at our office.

## Deadline to Register to Vote

The last day to register to vote for the June 5, 2018 Statewide Direct Primary Election is Monday, May 21st, this can be done online at [registertovote.ca.gov](http://registertovote.ca.gov). If eligible residents miss the deadline, they can register in person and conditionally vote a provisional ballot up to and on Election Day. We urge registering as early as possible to avoid unnecessary waiting and to receive a regular ballot and voting materials.

A voter should complete a new registration form if they move or change their name or political party preference. To register to vote, a person must be a U.S. citizen, at least 18 years old on or before Election Day, and not imprisoned or on parole for a felony.

Online registrations will be accepted as long as they are completed before midnight on May 21st; paper registration applications that are postmarked by May 21st will also be accepted. Registration applications are available at any Placer County post office, public library, or DMV, or may be requested by mail at 530-886-5650.

On January 1, 2017, a new process called Conditional Voter Registration (CVR) became effective in California. Under this new law, eligible voters who missed the 15-day registration deadline have the opportunity to come to the Elections Office within 14 days of and on Election Day, register and conditionally vote a ballot.

While Conditional Voter Registration is now an option, Placer County residents are strongly encouraged to continue to register to vote as early as possible to avoid unnecessary waiting and to receive a Sample Ballot Pamphlet.
