

NOTICE BY THE PLACER COUNTY REGISTRAR OF VOTERS OF MEASURES TO BE VOTED ON AT THE GUBERNATORIAL GENERAL ELECTION.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN by Jim McCauley, Placer County Clerk-Recorder-Registrar of Voters, in accordance with the provisions of the Election Laws of the State of California, on Tuesday, November 2, 2010 there will be a Gubernatorial General Election.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that consolidated with the Gubernatorial General Election the following measure shall be put to a vote of the qualified voters in the Western Placer Unified School District:

Measure J – Western Placer Unified School District

To help protect local schools from state budget cuts, improve the quality of education at all our local schools, modernize classroom technology and job training programs, construct new science and computer labs, improve school safety, build new classrooms and become eligible for millions in additional state school construction grants, shall the Western Placer Unified School District issue \$163 million in bonds at lawful interest rates with citizens' oversight and no money for administrator salaries?

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that consolidated with the Gubernatorial General Election the following measure shall be put to a vote of the qualified voters in the City of Lincoln:

Measure K – City of Lincoln

Temporary City of Lincoln Essential City Services Protection Measure. To help maintain and protect Lincoln's financial viability and essential services including 9-1-1 emergency/medical response times, helping prevent cuts to police officers, firefighters, library and recreation services, shall the City of Lincoln establish a temporary 3.75% utility users tax ordinance that expires in 4 years, with annual independent audits, public expenditure reports, citizens oversight, low-income senior exemptions, with all revenue dedicated solely for Lincoln and not the State?

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that direct arguments for or against Measure J shall be submitted to the Placer County Office of Elections and direct arguments for or against measure K will be filed with the Lincoln City Clerk. Said arguments shall not exceed 300 words in length and may be received or withdrawn, but not changed, prior to and including August 6, 2010 at 5:00 PM. The elections official shall cause (if submitted) one argument for and/or one argument against said measure(s) to be printed and shall cause to be enclosed a copy thereof in each sample ballot. If multiple arguments are submitted either for or against a measure, the elections official shall choose and print one argument in accordance with applicable law or procedure.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that, for individuals interested in submitting arguments for or against said measure(s), the physical address for the Placer County Office of Elections is 2956 Richardson Drive, Auburn. The mailing address for the Placer County Office of Elections is PO Box 5278, Auburn, CA 95604. The physical address for the Lincoln City Clerk is 600 6th Street, Lincoln CA 95648. The mailing address for the Lincoln City Clerk is the same as above.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that when the elections official has selected the direct arguments for and against said measure(s), the elections official shall send copies of the

argument in favor of said measure(s) to the authors of the argument against and copies of the argument against to the authors of the argument in favor. The authors may prepare and submit rebuttal arguments not to exceed 250 words. The rebuttal arguments must be filed with the Placer County Registrar of Voters for measure J and with the Lincoln City Clerk for Measure K not later than 10 days after the final date for filing direct arguments. The final date for rebuttal arguments is August 16, 2010 at 5:00 PM.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that California Elections Code Section 9600 governs the form of said arguments and/or rebuttals. Arguments and/or rebuttals submitted to the Placer County Office of Elections and the Lincoln City Clerk must follow this form.
